Systems Transformation in Primary Health Care

SUSAN WILLIAMS is Assistant Deputy Minister of Primary Health Care Division with Alberta Health. She is the ADM responsible for leading one of the Ministry's priority initiatives: Primary Health Care Reform. Susan is responsible for developing, supporting and implementing direction for a provincial primary health care strategy including the establishment of Family Care Clinics (FCC) and further evolution of Primary Care Networks (PCNs). She provides medical and clinical advice and leadership to inform Albertans' on health strategic policy direction and promotes research and innovation, including leading the Alberta Health Technology Decision Process. Susan leads the development of health policy, developing standards, monitoring implementation plans and establishing targets for success for Primary Health Care,



Ambulatory and Acute Care, Emergency Health Services and Cancer Care, which includes Wait time Policy. She is also leading the implementation of the Alberta Addiction and Mental Health Strategy focusing on prevention of addiction and mental illness, supporting safe communities, enhancing social supports for the homeless and providing effective addiction and mental health treatment in the right place at the right time.

Susan has over 29 years experience in the Alberta government including Assistant Deputy Minister of Workforce Supports with Employment and Immigration, Acting ADM of International Trade and Regional Development with Economic Development and Senior Strategic Policy and Finance positions within Alberta Treasury.

Susan has a Master of Business Administration from the University of Alberta and a Master of Arts from McGill University.
