## Speaker Biographies



**Dr. Evan Lundall** is Central Zone Medical Director for Alberta Health Services since 2000. He shares accountability for the Central Zone with Kerry Bales, Senior Vice-President. Passionate about health care in rural Alberta, Dr. Lundall ran a full-time, full-service medical practice for over 23 years, serving the rural community of Trochu and Three Hills and surrounding area.

In 2006 he spearheaded the creation of a Primary Care Network. As Board Chairman and Lead Administrative Physician for the Big Country Primary Care Network (PCN), Dr. Lundall was integral in planning and establishing the PCN with four Central Zone communities, and subsequently initiated and established the expansion of the PCN, which now includes seven communities.

Dr. Lundall has also worked on site-management and Regional Health Authority committees since the 1990s. He has served on many other committees, including the Medical Advisory Committee, the Records and Informatics Committee and its Executive Committee. He was also a member of the Provincial IM/IT Consultation Group and the Provincial Rural Strategy Group.

He lives in Red Deer with Charmaine, his wife. He has 3 daughters, 2 son-in-laws and 1 beautiful granddaughter.



**Kerry Bales** is Central Zone Senior Vice-President for Alberta Health Services. He shares accountability for the Central Zone with Dr. Evan Lundall, Zone Medical Director.

Mr. Bales has held variety of roles with AHS and the former David Thompson Health Authority over the past 15 years. His experience ranges from providing front-line nursing care in the community, to the acute care and continuing care sectors, to clinical, business and senior leadership roles. Prior to his current role, Mr. Bales was the Vice-President of the AHS Central Zone.

Through his active involvement in the delivery of front-line care, program development and leading the transition from legacy Regional Health Authorities to the AHS Central Zone, Mr. Bales has gained a keen awareness of the opportunities for building on the strong foundation of health service delivery in Central Alberta.
