**Brenda Huband** is the Alberta Health Services executive Leader for Health Operations in Central and Southern Alberta. Included in her portfolio are operational and direct health service delivery components including: Primary Health services, Continuing Care (Long Term Care, Home Care etc.), Addiction and Mental Health Services, Acute Care, Emergency Medical Services (EMS).

During the Southern Alberta Flood, Brenda was the Incident Commander in the Calgary Zone Emergency Operations Center. As part of the flood response, Brenda led the Health Operations teams in Calgary and surrounding area including working with EOC's and community leaders in the affected communities.

Brenda and Rick now Co-Lead the Recovery Response for Central and Southern Alberta.

**Rick Trimp** is the Leader of Population Health Improvement and Provincial Health Services for Alberta Health Services. Included in his portfolio are Cancer Care Alberta, Primary and Community Care, Mental Health and Addictions, Population and Public Health, and Emergency Medical Services (EMS). Rick's position is an executive level position at Alberta Health Services.

During the Southern Alberta Flood, Rick was the Incident Commander in the Provincial Emergency Operations Center. As part of the flood response, Rick led the Public Health teams on the ground performing flooded housing inspections, working with community leaders in the affected communities and was the primary liaison between AHS and the provincial government.
