Lieutenant-Colonel Rick Warren joined the Navy in 1982. As his career progressed, he has held several positions including a Regional Administration Officer for 12 clinics located in the Atlantic Area, Deputy Commanding Officer in Ontario and National Medical Liaison Team Leader in East Timor.

From 2004 to 2007, Lieutenant-Colonel Warren worked as a medical planner at the strategic and operational levels within Deputy Chief of Defence Staff COS J3 Group and Canadian Expeditionary Force Command. He was involved in medical planning for all deployed missions and his duties took him several deployed operations such as Bosnia, Kabul and Kandahar.

Since 2007, he was the Deputy Commanding Officer of Canadian Forces Health Centre Ottawa and most recently the Clinic Manager of the Base Medical Clinic in Petawawa.

Lieutenant-Colonel Warren has a degree in business, a diploma in Health Services Management from Ryerson University and a Masters degree in Health Sciences from the University of Toronto. He is a Canadian Land Forces Command Staff College graduate and is a member of the Canadian College of Health Services Executives.
